

TERRANOBLE 'S HARVEST 2024 HAS BEGUN

At TerraNoble, the 2024 vintage has just begun. On Thursday, February 28, we harvested the first kilos of Pinot Noir for the Algarrobo wine range in our Algarrobo vineyard, located in the Las Dichas area within the Casablanca Valley. And in the Maule Valley, we also harvested the first Chardonnay grapes for the base wine of our Cencellada sparkling wine.

For Pedro Vega, Viticulturist and Agricultural Manager, this is his 24th vintage at TerraNoble. "Every year is different. This vintage is starting with a delay of 15 to 20 days if compared with last year. We had a good bud break and good

initial shoot fertility but a somewhat longer-than-expected flowering process, which also meant a significantly longer véraison. Until December, spring temperatures were lower than normal, thus contributing to the phenological delay observed currently.

According to Marcelo García, Chief Winemaker at TerraNoble, "This vintage is very significant for me, as it is the 25th of my career and the ninth at TerraNoble. Although it is still too early to judge the quality of the fruit we will be receiving at the winery, I see grapes of good health, concentration, and quality".
