

TERRANOBLE REAFFIRMS ITS COMMITMENT TO THE CARMENERE GRAPE

Since 1994, when Carmenere was rediscovered in Chile, confused with Merlot, TerraNoble has made Carmenere an integral part of its essence, looking for new origins to grow it, together with new viticulture and winemaking techniques.

As part of this commitment, our winemaker Marcelo García and viticulturist Pedro Vega invited the Chilean wine press on a journey through the history of Carmenere.

A vertical tasting of 6 vintages (2011, 2012, 2014, 2016, 2018 and 2020) of our CA1 Andes and CA2 Costa carmenere wines was presented.

Under similar vinification and aging conditions, these wines stand out for the influence of the Andes Mountains and the Pacific Ocean in our terroir, and our guests were able to appreciate this uniqueness in this learning journey.
