

INTRODUCING ALGARROBO CERO CUATRO,
A NEW HIGH-END PINOT NOIR

Born in Algarrobo estate, Las Dichas, this GA.04 clone Pinot Noir has earned recognition from the world's most influential wine guides and critics, cementing Casablanca Valley's reputation as a source of exceptional coastal wines.

Algarrobo Cero Cuatro is born in Campo Algarrobo, in Las Dichas, one of the coolest areas of Casablanca Valley, inspired by the Chilean algarrobo tree, a native species known for its exceptional resilience.

Made from 100% Pinot Noir grapes, GA.04 clone originally from Vosne-Romanee, the fruit comes from granite soils with red clay and low moisture retention, allowing for slow, fresh and precise ripening.

Its vinification combines hand harvesting under morning fog, whole cluster fermentation, native yeasts and 16 months of aging in 400-liter French oak barrels. This is a limited production wine, and cases are still available for the international market.
